The Wrecking Crew

Starting in the late 1950's a group of "first-call" session players fell in with each other and were the go-to musicians for record producers in California. Unlike other talented session players, they did not feel rock and roll was beneath them and they took the jobs. Instead of showing up in blue blazers and ties, they came in jeans, sweatshirts, and sandals. They were talented and well-schooled musicians who

could instinctively get what the producers wanted and, bingo, they were in and out of the studio leaving hundreds of #1, top-10, and top-40 hits behind. The Wrecking Crew members, as they now have become known, are the foundation on which countless recording artists stood. From Frank Sinatra to The Beach Boys, from The Ronettes to Simon and Garfunkle, the Wrecking Crew could do it all, brilliantly.
