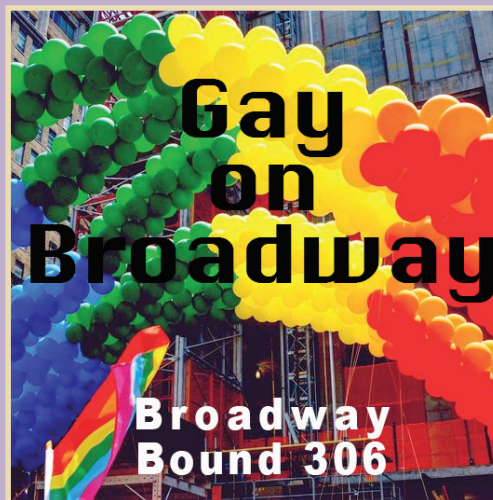

50 years ago today, the Stonewall Inn bar in Greenwich Village was raided by New York City police as was customary at the time. The Stonewall was frequented by gay people, owned by the Mafia, and was a safe haven most of the time, unless the police did their usual roundup of men in dresses, drag queens, for breaking the law – wearing clothing that did not jive with your gender. Yup, in 1969 NYC you could be arrested for the clothes you wore.

That night, however, would be the last round-up. The drag queens fought back, resisted arrest, and had “had it.” A riot ensued. Word got out in the larger gay community. The next night hundreds of gay and straight



supporters joined the fight. The riots went on for three nights. Stonewall was the spark that ignited the modern gay rights movement.

Broadway musicals never touched the reality of gay people’s lives. It was taboo. After Stonewall, however, starting in 1974, gay was being included in musical theater with the first toe in the water in the off-Broadway musical “Let My People Come.” In 1983 a major breakthrough came on Broadway with “La Cage aux Folles.”

On this edition of Broadway Bound we celebrate Gay On Broadway. From nothing to everywhere in 45 years.
